THE MUSEUM OF MODERN ART TO CONTINUE EXTENDED FRIDAY AND SATURDAY EVENING HOURS THROUGH 2017

Collection and Exhibition Galleries, MoMA Stores, and Select Café Service Open until 9:00 p.m. on Fridays and Saturdays through December 30

NEW YORK, August 15, 2017—Following the success of its extended Summer Hours program in July and August, The Museum of Modern Art will continue to offer extended hours, remaining open until 9:00 p.m. on Fridays and Saturdays through December 30 in order to provide more opportunities for visitors—and especially New Yorkers who work during the day—to enjoy the Museum in the evening hours. Cocktails and snacks are available for purchase, and The Abby Aldrich Rockefeller Sculpture Garden will be open late (weather permitting). **UNIQLO Free Friday Nights** will also be extended until 9:00 p.m. through the end of the year.

In addition to works on display in the Museum's world-class collection galleries, this fall's exhibitions include **Max Ernst: Beyond Painting**, which surveys the career of the preeminent Dada and Surrealist artist through works in the Museum's collection, with particular emphasis on his ceaseless experimentation; **Louise Bourgeois: An Unfolding Portrait**, the first major museum exhibition to show the comprehensive body of Bourgeois's little-known printed work; **Items: Is Fashion Modern?**, an investigation of 111 garments and accessories that have had a profound effect on the world over the last century; **Club 57: Film, Performance, and Art in the East Village, 1978–1983**, the first major exhibition examining the scene-changing, interdisciplinary life of downtown New York's seminal exhibition, music, and performance space; and **Stephen Shore**, the first US survey to encompass Shore's career in photography, from the gelatin silver prints he made as a teenager to his current engagement with digital platforms. The late hours also provide additional opportunities to see this summer's major exhibitions before they close—**Robert Rauschenberg: Among Friends** is open through September 17, and **Frank Lloyd Wright at 150: Unpacking the Archive** is open through October 1.

Screening in the Museum's Roy and Niuta Titus Theaters this fall are **Kelly Reichardt: Powerfully Observant**, a mid-career retrospective including the six intricately produced and fiercely independent feature films she has made since 1994; **3-D Funhouse: Recent Restorations from the 3-D Film Archive**, a weeklong tribute to the 3-D Film Archive, whose curators have dedicated themselves to collecting, restoring, and presenting in digital form the stereoscopic films of the analog era; and **Modern Matinees: Directed by John Cassavetes**, a celebration of the fiercely independent director who steadfastly worked outside the Hollywood studio system to bring truly authentic, relatable narratives to the screen.

The second-floor espresso bar will remain open until 9:00 p.m. on Fridays and Saturdays, offering wine and light fare in addition to its regular menu. The Garden Bar will remain open until 9:00 p.m. through October 1. (Cafe 2 and Terrace 5 will continue to close every day at 5:00 p.m.; Cafe 2 remains open until 7:30 p.m. on Fridays.)

Visitors can also experience the Museum's new and renovated spaces that opened in June, including the extended Bauhaus staircase, a new lounge facing The Abby Aldrich Rockefeller Sculpture Garden, an additional coat check and renovated restrooms on the ground floor, a second-floor store next to the remodeled Cafe 2, an expanded espresso bar, and reconfigured galleries on the third floor, where the Frank Lloyd Wright exhibition remains on view through October 1.
