**Hours:** 10:00 a.m.– 5:00 p.m. Thursday through Monday; 10:00 a.m.–7:45 p.m. Friday.  
Closed Tuesday, Wednesday, Thanksgiving and Christmas.

**Admission:** \$12; \$8.50 full-time students with ID and people 65 and over.  
Free for members and children under 12 accompanied by an adult.  
Friday, 4:00–7:45 p.m. pay-what-you-wish.

**Subway:**

- 7 Local train to 33 Street/Queens Boulevard station (approximately a 15-minute ride from Grand Central Station). MoMA QNS is right across Queens Boulevard from 33 Street station.
- E or V trains to 23 Street/Ely Avenue station. It is approximately a 15-minute walk along Thomson Avenue/Queens Boulevard to MoMA QNS (right on 33 Street).
- N or W train to Queensboro Plaza station. Transfer across the platform to the 7 Local train (to Flushing). Go one stop to 33 Street/Queens Boulevard station. MoMA QNS is right across Queens Boulevard from 33 Street station.

**Bus:**

- From Manhattan: Q32 or Q60 to 33 Street at Queens Boulevard.
- Within Queens: Q39 to 31 Street at Thomson Avenue.

**Artlink Shuttle:** Queens Artlink, a courtesy weekend shuttle bus service, provides transportation between MoMA in midtown Manhattan and cultural destinations in Queens: MoMA QNS, P.S.1 Contemporary Art Center, Isamu Noguchi Garden Museum and Museum for African Art (opening September 2002), Socrates Sculpture Park, Sculpture Center (opening fall 2002) and American Museum of the Moving Image. **Car or Taxi:** From Manhattan: Take the 59 Street (Queensboro) bridge to Queens and follow signs to Queens Boulevard (Route 25). Turn right on Van Dam Street, left on 47 Avenue, and another left on 33 Street. The entrance is on the left, between Queens Boulevard and 47 Avenue.

From Long Island: Take the Long Island Expressway (495) to Van Dam Street exit. Turn right on Van Dam Street and right again on Queens Boulevard (Route 25). Continue to 33 Street.

**Parking:** Park and pay at LaGuardia Commuter Parking, Thomson Avenue and 31 Street.  
Metered street parking available on a first-come, first-served basis.

**Mobility access:** All galleries and facilities are accessible to wheelchairs and strollers. Wheelchairs are available in the Lobby at the Member Services Desk free of charge.

**Cameras:** Photography is permitted only with hand-held cameras in permanent collection galleries; no flash or tripods are allowed. Videotaping is permitted only in the Lobby. No photographs may be reproduced, distributed, or sold without permission from the Museum.

**Checkroom:** All bags are subject to security inspection before entering the galleries. All backpacks (any size) and umbrellas, parcels, bags, and purses larger than 11 x 14 inches (28 x 35.5 cm) must be checked.

**Café:** Beverages and light refreshments are available at the Café on the Mezzanine.
