WARM UP 2019 TAKES PLACE EVERY SATURDAY IN JULY AND AUGUST

Ticket Package for All Dates Now Available for a Limited Time Only

LONG ISLAND CITY, New York, April 17, 2019— MoMA PS1's pioneering outdoor music series Warm Up returns in 2019 with nine Saturdays of the best in live and electronic music. Known for its innovative and ambitious program, Warm Up celebrates a wide range of artists: emerging and established, local and global, and across genres. Warm Up 2019 runs every Saturday in July and August, from July 6 through August 31, with the full lineup to be announced in May.

Advance tickets are now available for all Warm Up dates. Additionally, MoMA PS1 has launched a special ticket package offering admission and expedited entry for all nine dates, available for \$99 for a limited time. Full ticketing information follows below.

This year, MoMA PS1 is partnering with The Lot Radio for a special Warm Up-focused radio series airing on Thursdays from 12 to 2 p.m., featuring DJ sets from Warm Up curators, past and future performers, and friends of the program. The show will premiere on May 16 highlighting the newly-announced lineup for the season.

Now in its 22nd season, Warm Up is one of the longest running music programs housed within a museum. As an integral part of MoMA PS1's curatorial program, Warm Up seeks to elevate innovative, underrepresented voices and connect fans with music's most important artists. The program's alumni include contemporary creators Solange, Black Dice, Cardi B, Jamie XX, Lizzo, Skepta, Thom Yorke, Four Tet, and A-Trak as well as legendary DJs including Derrick May, DJ Premier, and Ritchie Hawtin.

Each year, Warm Up takes place within a site-specific installation by the winners of the Young Architects Program. This year's winner, *Hórama Rama* by Mexico Citybased architects Pedro & Juana, is a 40-foot-tall cyclorama featuring jungle imagery that sits atop the courtyard walls, providing a refuge amid the changing Long Island City skyline. Warm Up attendees are also encouraged to visit the museum galleries and experience MoMA PS1's acclaimed exhibitions of contemporary art from around the world.

Warm Up 2019 is organized by a curatorial committee led by Taja Cheek, Assistant Curator, MoMA PS1, with Eliza Ryan, Naomi Zeichner (YouTube), Dean Bein (True Panther Records), Isabelia Herrera (Remezcla), Jonas Leon (On-Retainer Agency), and Matt Werth (RVNG Intl.).

MoMA PS1 is devoted to today's most experimental, thought-provoking contemporary art. Founded in 1976 as the P.S.1 Contemporary Art Center, it was the first nonprofit arts center in the United States devoted solely to contemporary art and is recognized as a defining force in the alternative space movement. In 2000 The Museum of Modern Art and P.S.1 Contemporary Art Center merged, creating the largest platform for contemporary art in the country and one of the largest in the world. Functioning as a living, active meeting place for the general public, MoMA PS1 is a catalyst for ideas, discourses, and new trends in contemporary art.

Hours: MoMA PS1 is open from 12:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m., Thursday through Monday. Closed on Thanksgiving, Christmas, and New Year's Day.

Admission: \$10 suggested donation; \$5 for students and senior citizens; free for New York City residents, MoMA members, and MoMA admission ticket holders within 14 days of visit. Free admission as a Gift to New Yorkers made possible by the Anna-Maria and Stephen Kellen Foundation.

Directions: MoMA PS1 is located at 22-25 Jackson Avenue at 46th Ave in Long Island City, Queens, across the Queensboro Bridge from midtown Manhattan. Traveling by subway, take the E, M, or 7 to Court Sq; or the G to Court Sq or 21 St-Van Alst. By bus, take the Q67 to Jackson and 46th Ave or the B62 to 46th Ave.
