**Project EATS Announces Inaugural Exhibition Program featuring artists  
Maren Hassinger, David Hammons, and film by Arthur Jafa and Garrett Bradley**

Project EATS presents a series of artist commissions bringing art from inside museums and galleries and out into neighborhoods around New York City. The 2022–2023 commissions are presented in conjunction with the exhibition *Just Above Midtown: Changing Spaces* at The Museum of Modern Art.

Founded in 2009 by Just Above Midtown gallery founder and artist Linda Goode Bryant, Project EATS is a living installation transforming vacant lots and rooftops into neighborhood-based farms across New York City. Communities deserve to grow their own food right where they live—Art that feeds.

Just as artists at Just Above Midtown gallery were invited to push their artistic practices, take their creativity to new heights, and collaborate, this series of artist commissions enacts JAM in the present—inviting living artists who exhibited at the gallery during the 1970s and 1980s, as well as those who were influenced by its legacy and spirit later on, to create anew.
