# MoMA TO OPEN THE SECOND ANNUAL PRESENTATION OF STUDIO SOUND SERIES WITH NEW OPERA BY ARTIST SABLE ELYSE SMITH

**NEW YORK, May 16, 2024**— MoMA presents *Studio Sound: Sable Elyse Smith* in the Marie-Josée and Henry Kravis Studio from July 3 through 14, 2024. Studio Sound is an annual performance series that champions artists and musicians whose work engages new possibilities for sound and music. The second presentation of Studio Sound features a new opera titled *If you unfolded us* by interdisciplinary artist and writer Sable Elyse Smith, in collaboration with composer David Dominique and vocalist Freddie June. Serving as the first part of a larger ongoing project, the performance intertwines an unfolding love story between two Black women with the protagonist's journey of self-discovery, staged within the intimate scale of the Kravis Studio. *Studio Sound: Sable Elyse Smith* is organized by Martha Joseph, The Phyllis Ann and Walter Borten Assistant Curator of Media and Performance, with May Makki, Curatorial Assistant, Department of Media and Performance.

Taking the musical potential of text as her starting point, Smith explores voice as artistic material in this immersive multimedia performance. The work, an opera for two voices and eight-piece chamber ensemble, is structured in two parts, each consisting of a series of songs that weave together a narrative of desire, rejection, self-discovery, and resilience. Smith shares, "Narratively, I'm interested in elevating a story of vulnerability—the stuff of everyday life—to something remarkable, fashioning a new kind of epic tale within the formal and aesthetic space of opera, and pushing its conceptual potential." Smith wrote the libretto and has created video for the performance. Through a cinematic approach, she combines found footage with imagery from the performers' interior worlds. In addition to the live events, during the Museum hours listed below, the Studio transforms into a multimedia installation, featuring film and sound from the performance.

Dominique's score fuses traditional and popular musical forms, with influences ranging from R&B and jazz to musique concrète and contemporary chamber music. Set against the backdrop of a developing storm, the performance explores the political, collective, and dramatic potential of the voice, as well as the ways in which language dissolves through sonic expression.

Over the past decade, Smith's work has drawn from the legacy of Conceptual art to confront the mundane and pervasive impacts of systemic oppression. Notable recent works included in *The Milk of Dreams*, 59th Venice Biennale (2022), *Whitney Biennial* 2022: *Quiet as It's Kept*, Whitney Museum of American Art, New York (2022), and *Marking Time: Art in the Age of Mass Incarceration*, MoMA PS1, Queens (2020) addressed the architectural, psychological, and material aspects of the prison as a site. Working in video, sculpture, photography, text, and now sound, Smith's approach extends our understanding of the



carceral beyond prison walls and into the systems that determine everyday inequities within a culture of anti-Blackness.

To coincide with Smith's performance, work from her *Coloring Book* series will be on view in MoMA's collection display Gallery 415: *Divided States of America*, emphasizing the artist's deep conceptual investments across media, from drawing to video and live art.
