

WARM UP 2024 BEGINS THIS WEEK WITH SEASON FEATURING TERENCE DIXON, KIM ANH, NICK LEÓN, DJ PYTHON, UNIIQU3, EMMA DJ, KODE9, AND MANY MORE

SIX FRIDAYS IN JULY AND AUGUST

LONG ISLAND CITY, New York, July 8, 2024—MoMA PS1's iconic summer music series, Warm Up, begins this Friday, July 12, featuring DJ sets and live performances from 4 to 10 p.m. on six Friday evenings in July and August. Amplifying under-recognized subcultures and communities traversing experimental music and nightlife, the program charts new and historic origin points for innovations in electronic music.

Over the course of each evening, four distinct sets build from ambient or experimental sound into dancefloor breakbeats. This year's lineup includes artists such as Detroit techno pioneer **Terrence Dixon**; queer nightlife icon **KIM ANH**; Paris-based soul-crushing electronica producer **Emma dj**; Atlanta-based founder of Underground & Black **Ash Lauryn**; avant-garde ensemble **Tongue in the Mind**, a collaboration between artists Juliana Huxtable, Jealous Orgasm, and Via App; co-founder of the São Paulo collective and record label Mamba Negra **Cashu**; rising Miami-based trance musicians **SoFTT**; Hyperdub label founder **Code9**; and Jersey club luminary **UNIIQU3**. The complete lineup follows below. Tickets are now available for all dates.

Warm Up takes place in the MoMA PS1 courtyard, on a stage designed by artist Stewart Uoo, who was featured in *Greater New York*. Riffing on the alternate history of New York School painting as a background for dance theater and social performance, Uoo has pooled polychromatic paint on silk and canvas to stain the setting with vibrant color in a summery palette of radical optimism. The centerpiece of Uoo's installation is a custom disco ball sculpture based on a found tire with a deep tread of inlaid mirror that casts a reflection of luminous track prints across the Warm Up stage and dance floor. In addition, artist Yto Barrada's first major outdoor work, *Le Grand Soir*, serves as an interactive seating structure for the event. Warm Up attendees are also encouraged to visit the museum galleries and experience the full slate of MoMA PS1 exhibitions.

A group of leading cultural practitioners linked to the city's sound, music, and nightlife scenes serve as this year's host committee: Korakrit Arunanondchai (Ghost/BKK), E. Jane (MHYSA), Tom Laprade (Montez Press Radio), Oscar Nñ (Papi Juice), and Jen Sillen (Rash/Club Cringe).

Since 1998, Warm Up has presented experimental and avant-garde music that forms an integral part of PS1's multidisciplinary programming. A groundbreaking and influential series that amplifies emerging, underground, and legendary performers alike, Warm Up has presented renowned DJs and producers such as Honey Dijon, SOPHIE, DJ Spooky, Lary 7, Richie Hawtin, Arca, MikeQ, and Kim Ann Foxman.

Food by Street Vendor Project will be available for purchase, as part of a continued collaboration with the organization that advocates for street vendors' rights in New York. Additionally, Bronx Móvil will provide harm reduction resources at each program.

Warm Up 2024 is organized by Kari Rittenbach, Assistant Curator, and Nick Scavo, Senior Project Manager, Music, Performance, and Events, with Sheldon Gooch, Curatorial Assistant.

ABOUT MoMA PS1

MoMA PS1 champions art and artists at the intersection of the social, cultural, and political issues of our time. Providing audiences with the agency to ask questions, access to knowledge, and a forum for public debate, PS1 has offered insight into artists' diverse worldviews for more than 40 years. Founded in 1976 by Alanna Heiss, the institution was a defining force in the alternative space movement in New York City, transforming a nineteenth century public schoolhouse in Long Island City into a site for artistic experimentation and creativity. PS1 has been a member of New York City's Cultural Institutions Group (CIG) since 1982 and affiliated with The Museum of Modern Art since 2000.

Directions: MoMA PS1 is located at 22-25 Jackson Avenue at 46th Ave in Long Island City, Queens, across the Queensboro Bridge from midtown Manhattan. Traveling by subway, take the E, M, or 7 to Court Sq; or the G to Court Sq or 21 St Van Alst. By bus, take the Q67 to Jackson and 46th Ave or the B62 to 46th Ave.
